Tanya Mohrbacher, New Sewickley Township, requested a Delinquent Tax Exoneration on property recently purchased in the District. She said that the Township forgave the delinquent taxes and requested the District do the same stating that if the school district does not approve exonerating the taxes she will be unable to purchase the property. Total cost is \$2,630.31 which includes the principal, interest and penalty.

These changes will have a devastating impact on Pennsylvania's School-Based ACCESS Program that assists schools in providing medically-necessary services to children with disabilities.

- Several mechanical repairs were completed at the High School including a new return air motor on roof top 20 and a replacement bearing installed on the return air fan cage RTU 13A. Repairs to motors, thermostats and relays on several electric space heaters have been completed.
- Replaced a faulty mix air damper in room B213 of the Elementary School. Currently working with the manufacturer for coverage thru Belimo's five-year warrantee program.
- The fire alarm system in the Elementary building required control work to setup the communication between the Elementary and Middle School buildings. All building fire alarm systems are now repaired and communicating as designed.
- Middle School back flow preventers have been installed and tested. Completed the
  installation of a new bladder for the domestic expansion tank which supplies the hot
  water needs for the district.

# **FACILITIES MASTER PLAN:**

A progress update was given by Dr. Fuller, Superintendent, saying VEBH was interested in speaking with us but the scope of the project first needs identified and pre-construction costs determined to get a better idea of total cost.
